JUDICIAL CONDUCT BOARD OF PENNSYLVANIA ELECTS NEW OFFICERS

HARRISBURG, August 30, 2004 — The Judicial Conduct Board of Pennsylvania recently announced the election of new officers for 2004.

The new Chairman is the Honorable Samuel J. Magaro, the Vice-Chair is Mark C. Schultz, Esquire and the Secretary is Patrick Judge, Sr.

Judge Magaro, Senior District Justice, served Lower Paxton Township (Dauphin County) from 1975-2003 and has been a District Justice member of the Board since August 16, 2001. A former Judge of the Court of Judicial Discipline, 1994-1999, he served as President of the Special Court Judges Association of Pennsylvania from 1999-2000.

Mark C. Schultz, an attorney with the Cozen O'Connor law firm in Philadelphia, was elected Vice-Chair. He earned his bachelor of arts degree at Clark University and his law degree at Villanova University, and has served as an attorney member of the Board since August 16, 2002.

Patrick Judge, Sr. has served as a lay member of the Board since August 16, 2003. Mr. Judge is Executive Vice-President and Secretary of Keystone Automotive Operations, Inc. and A & A Auto Stores, the nation's largest of its kind automotive accessory and parts distribution company.

The Judicial Conduct Board is composed of three (3) judges, three (3) attorneys and six (6) public members.
